Brief outline on CSR Policy of the Company

JPCL has only one project i.e Rangit IV HE Project (120 MW), which is under construction stage and there are neither any revenue from operation nor any operating profit, though the company has earned book profit on account of interest earned on unutilised Equity contribution received from parent company parked in bank account.

JPCL is yet to formulate and adopt a CSR & Sustainability Policy in compliance with the provisions of Section 135 of the Companies Act, 2013 and the Companies (Corporate Social Responsibility Policy) Rules, 2014 read with its amendments & General Circulars issued on CSR by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs; and Guidelines/ Office Memorandums of Department of Public Enterprises.

Composition of Below Board Level CSR Committee

As per Section 135 of the Companies Act, 2013, the Company is required to undertake CSR activities in line with the prescribed provisions.

For the financial year 2025-26, the amount to be spent by the Company on CSR activities does not exceed ₹50 lakh. Accordingly, in terms of Section 135(9) of the Act the Company is not required to constitute CSR Committee and the functions of the CSR Committee are being discharged directly by the Board of Directors.

In pursuance of sub-rule (3) of Rule 8 of the Companies (Corporate Social Responsibility Policy) Rules, 2014, companies with CSR expenditure of ₹1 crore or more during a financial year are required to carry out an impact assessment of their CSR projects.

For the financial year 2025-26, the Company's CSR expenditure was less than ₹1 crore. Accordingly, no impact assessment of CSR projects has been undertaken.

CSR Expenditure

During the F.Y 2025-26, the Company has incurred ₹ 2.21 lakhs on CSR activities towards organising medical camp at 46- Sanghanath Gram Panchayat wherein free health check-ups and medicines were provided.

1. Background

Pursuant to the request received from the Gram Prashasan Kendra, 46-Sanganath Gram Panchayat Unit, Namchi, South Sikkim, through the office of the Executive Director, Rangit-IV HEP, the Medical Division of NHPC Rangit I.V. H.E.P. was entrusted with organizing a one-day medical outreach camp. The request emphasized the health-related challenges exacerbated by the onset of monsoons, particularly affecting remote and vulnerable communities.

Considering the prevailing needs and in alignment with NHPC's CSR-SD objectives for FY 2025–26, a One-Day Medical Camp was proposed and accordingly conducted on Saturday, 19th July 2025, at the identified site within the 46-Sanganath Gram Panchayat Unit located in the Wok Sikkip Block.

2. Objectives

- To provide general health consultations to the rural population.
- To conduct basic diagnostic services like Blood Pressure, Blood Sugar, ECG and Haemoglobin testing.
- To offer preventive and promote healthcare awareness.
- To distribute commonly used medicines free of cost to patients and local dispensary.

3. Execution & Outcome

The Medical Camp was successfully conducted with the joint efforts of the Medical Division of the Rangit-IV H.E.P led by Dr. Jeffin Joy Pullan, SMO, and the Medical Division of Rangit PS led by Dr. Chandrakant Pandey, Grp. Sr. DCMO, in coordination with the Gram Panchayat representatives.

Services Rendered:

- General Health Consultation by NHPC Medical Officers.
- BP, Blood Sugar and Haemoglobin testing conducted on-site.
- ECG screening for indicated cases.
- Free distribution of prescribed essential medicines.
- Health & hygiene awareness disseminated to the public.

The required manpower, including doctors, paramedics, and support staff, was deputed from both Rangit IV & Rangit PS establishments of NHPC. All medical consumables and medicines were locally procured in a cost-effective and timely manner, ensuring readiness for the camp.
